Smart phones are great tools to conduct research on! You can easily and quickly browse the internet, go on a specific app, or text a friend to learn about a new topic. Today, you will imagine that you found a phone that was used during the Westward Expansion. It is your job to describe the information that was found on the smartphone and identify who the phone belonged to!

Step 1: Select a Smart Phone Owner

You will choose an owner that lived during the Westward Expansion. You can choose a real historical figure, like George Washington. You can also create a fictional person, like a soldier named Joe who fought during the Revolutionary War. If you choose a fictional person, you should make sure that the information you provide is historically accurate. Write about your smart phone owner below.


