Build a prototype to show what the VR headset will look like.


- Requirements:

### **Sources to Use**



This is a map showing the different tribes of ancient Rome. The members of the Assembly were made up of representatives from different tribes. This is similar to the Congressional districts of U.S. Representatives today. The citizens who were members of the assemblies had the right to vote on laws.

The senate was the central institution in Roman politics, but its formal powers were few. It did not pass legislation or appoint magistrates, for example. As a matter of formal constitutional law, the senate was mainly an advisory institution whose members received delegations, digested reports, debated, and issued decrees, which were not legally binding. Nonetheless, in practice the senate had a considerable degree of authority during most of its existence. Over the last one hundred years of the Republic, the senate lost power to magistrates with popular followings. 11

"Whatever the People has last ordained shall be held as binding by law."

"The penalty shall be capital punishment for a judge or arbiter legally appointed who has been found guilty of receiving a bribe for giving a decision."

These are a couple of laws from the 'Twelve Tables'. The 'Twelve Tables' contained laws drafted in ancient Rome. These laws were to be followed by everyone in Roman society. They were intended to be equally enforced among all social classes. The 'Twelve Tables' influenced the constitutions and laws of other countries, like the U.S. Bill of Rights.



This is an image of the ruins of the Roman Forum. This was an area where everyday Romans would come together for activities like elections, trials and military parades. The Senate decided to expand the Forum during the Roman Republic so that it could hold more people for assemblies and gatherings of the people. This allowed people to hear what was being discussed by the politicians.
