# Whose Smart Phone is This?

Smart phones are a great way to learn new information! You can easily and quickly browse the Internet, go on a specific app, or text a friend to learn about a new topic. Today, you will imagine that you found a phone that was used during the civil war. It is your job to describe the information that was found on the smartphone and identify who the phone belonged to!

#### Step 1: Select a Smart Phone Owner

You will choose an owner that lived during the Civil War. You can choose a real historical figure, like George Washington. You can also create a fictional person, like a soldier named Joe who fought during the Revolutionary War. If you choose a fictional person, you should make sure that the information you provide is historically accurate. Write about your smart phone owner below.

#### Step 2: Create a Text Message Conversation

People use their smart phones to communicate with friends and family. You will need to write a text message conversation between the owner of your smart phone and another person. Fill out the information below about the person that is texting with your smart phone owner.

- Include the reason the owner is texting the other person (i.e. to get lunch, to inform the other person about current events)


