Researching My State

The governor is a person who is in charge of a state. The people of the state take a vote to decide who will be governor. People usually vote for governors who share their beliefs and care about similar issues. For example, farmers in Kansas might vote for someone to be governor who wants to give farmers more money to grow crops.

Governors have a lot of responsibilities! It is the governor's job to help decide how money will be spent in the state and sign bills into law. A bill is a suggestion for a new law made by state representative. After state representatives, like Congressmen and Senators vote to pass a bill into law, it is the job of the governor to sign the bill to make it a new law. Governors can also decide a bill shouldn't be passed into law, which is called vetoing a bill.

Governors also represent their state and tell others about all the great things a state is doing for the people who live there. For example, a governor may give a speech telling the rest of the United States about how the state is building new parks so kids have many places to play.

Since governors represent a state, it is important for them to know important information and facts about the state. For example, governors should know what types of businesses are in the state. For example, a governor in Kansas should know that there are a lot of farms that grow and sell crops, like wheat.

Today, you will imagine you are a governor who is in charge of planning a parade to celebrate your state. The parade will be held in two weeks! Follow the steps below.

Step 1: Learn About Your State

It is important for governors to learn information about their states. Before you can celebrate in the parade, look up information about your state.

To look up information on your state, use an online search engine and type in the name of your state. We suggest using "Kids National Geographic." If you are using "Kids National Geographic," click the yellow search bar at the top of the page and then type in the name of your state.

What does your state look like? Write or draw.




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Step 3: Design a Parade Float
